

Praying the Rosary during the October the Month of the Rosary At Our Lady of Grace School



October is the month of the rosary. Our Lady of Grace School has been praying the rosary all month. Each morning school begins with announcements and prayer all year long. For this month, we have been praying the rosary in the morning. There are four full weeks in October with five days a week. By the end of the month, we will have said four complete rosaries using all four types of mysteries.



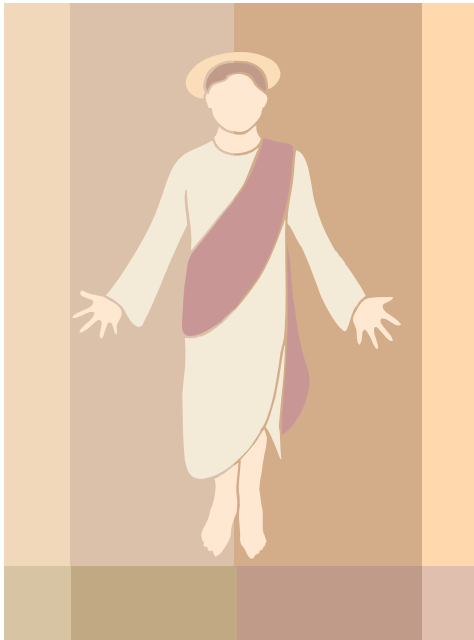
On Mondays, we begin the rosary with the Sign of the Cross, The Apostles Creed, Our Father, three Hail Marys, The Glory Be to the Father, naming the first mystery (more information about the mysteries later in the article), Our Father, ten Hail Marys, and the Glory Be to the Father. On Tuesdays through Thursdays, we say The Sign of the Cross, name the second, third, or fourth mystery, Our Father, ten Hail Marys, and the Glory Be to the Father. On Fridays we finish the rosary. We say The Sign of the Cross, name the fifth mystery, Our Father, ten Hail Marys, the Glory Be to the Father, and Hail Holy Queen.

Did you know that there are now four different mysteries of the rosary? There are the Five Joyful Mysteries, the Five Sorrowful Mysteries, the Five Glorious Mysteries, and the Five Luminous Mysteries. Each one of these twenty events in Jesus' life is remembered as you pray the rosary.

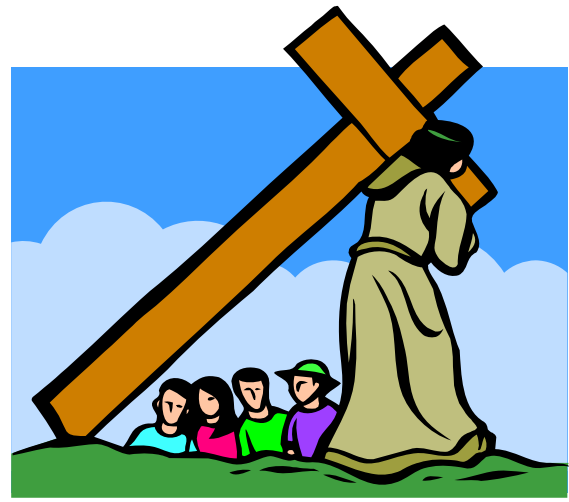




The Five Joyous Mysteries are:
The Annunciation, The Visitation,
The Birth of Our Lord, The
Presentation of Our Lord, and The
Finding of Our Lord in the
Temple.



The Five Glorious Mysteries are:
The Resurrection, The Ascension,
The Coming of the Holy Spirit, The
Assumption of Our Blessed Mother
into Heaven, and The Coronation of
Our Blessed Mother.



The Five Sorrowful Mysteries are: The Agony
in the Garden, The Scourging at the Pillar, The
Crowning with Thorns, The Carrying of the
Cross, and The Crucifixion and Death of Our
Lord.



The Five Luminous Mysteries are:
The Baptism in the Jordan, The
Wedding at Cana, The
Proclamation of the Kingdom, The
Transfiguration, and The Institution
of the Eucharist.
